Re: Summary of Department Activity in Quarter 1 of 2019

On behalf of Elm Grove EMS, please find the attached department summary for the first quarter of 2019. There were not any revisions from last quarter's report.

This quarter, there were a total of 98 calls for service (+16 from last quarter). Of those, 87 were in Elm Grove (89% of total, -2% from last quarter) and 12 were mutual aid calls (12%, +3%), or calls to surrounding municipalities. A total of 79 patients (+2) were evaluated, with 68 (+7) being transported to the hospital (86% of the total patient evaluations, +7%).

A collective 433 EMS personnel responded to those 98 calls for service (CFS), an average of 4 personnel per CFS. These personnel spent nearly **85 cumulative hours** on calls this quarter. This does not include time spent performing 4 blood draws (+2) this quarter for the Elm Grove Police Department. It also does not account for time spent at trainings, departmental/committee meetings, public relation events, nor the countless number of other volunteer hours our members donate behind the scenes to ensure the department runs smoothly.

There have had a total of 98 CFS year to date (+19 compared to this same time last year), with 89% (+12%) being in the Village. A total of 79 patients have been examined (+10 compared to this same time last year), and 68 (86%, +9%) of those have been transported to a hospital.

Our monthly training topics for the quarter included

- Annual blood borne pathogens review
- Ice Rescue Training in Village Park with the Fire Department
- Splinting of extremity injuries
- Bi-annual CPR recertification

Public relation events for this quarter included

- Teaching the Girl Scouts at Tonawanda about first aid and bandaging.

We also

- continue work on taking delivery of a new ambulance in January 2020.



Chart 1: Call Volume by Day of Week, by Quarter

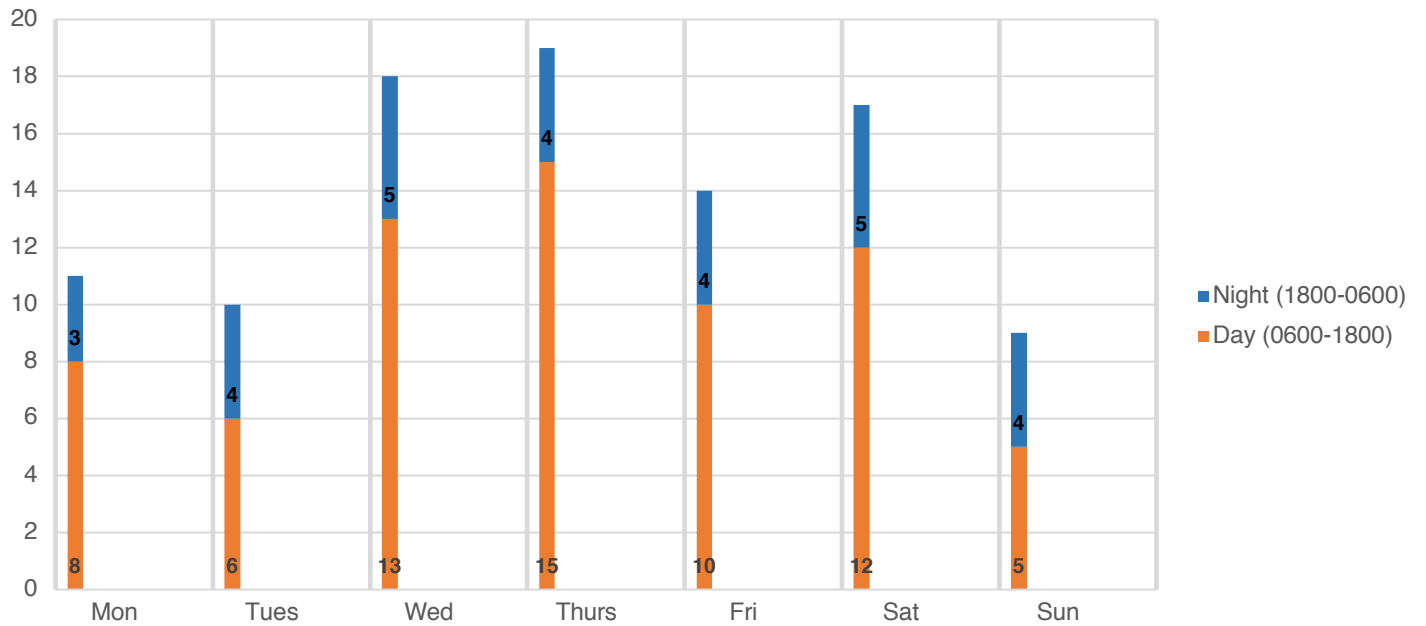


Chart 2: Total Call Volume by Day of Week, YTD

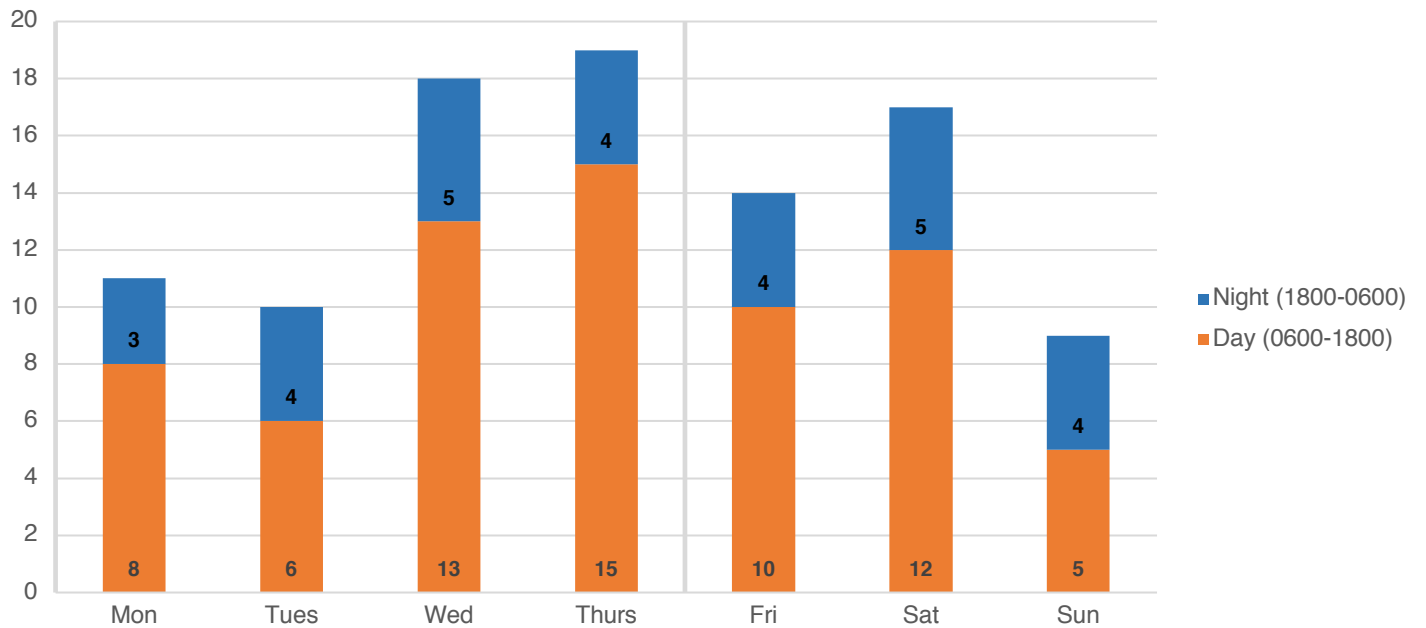


Chart 3: Call Volume by Hour of Day, by Quarter

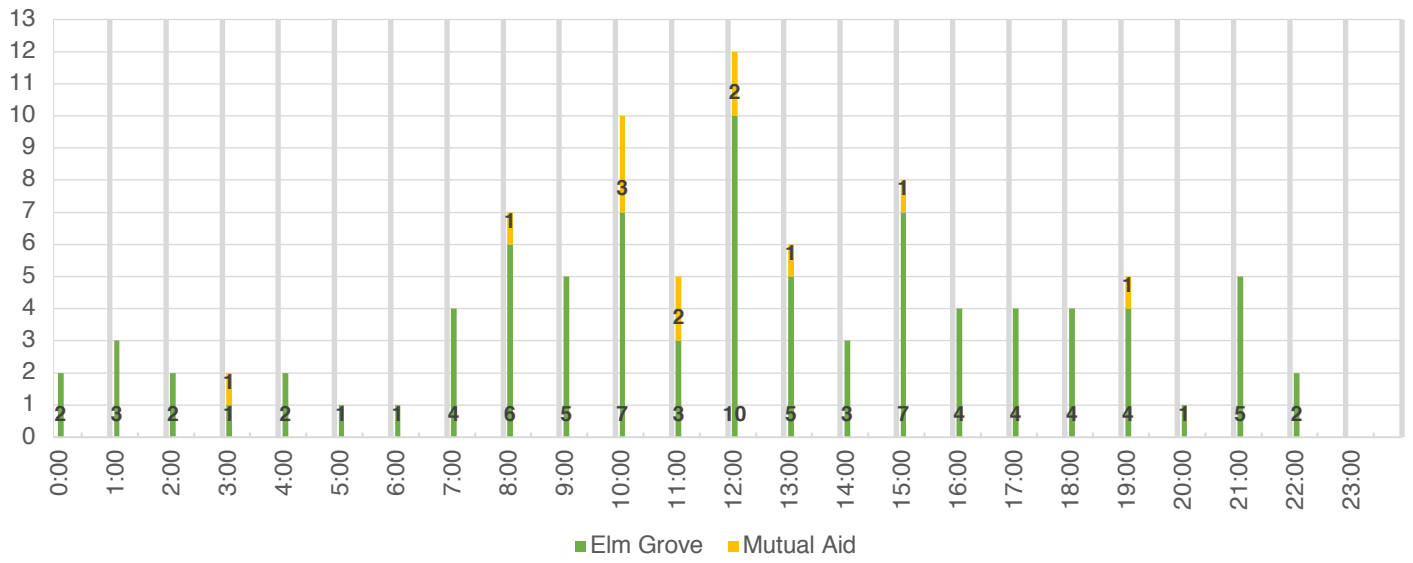


Chart 4: Total Call Volume by Hour of Day, YTD

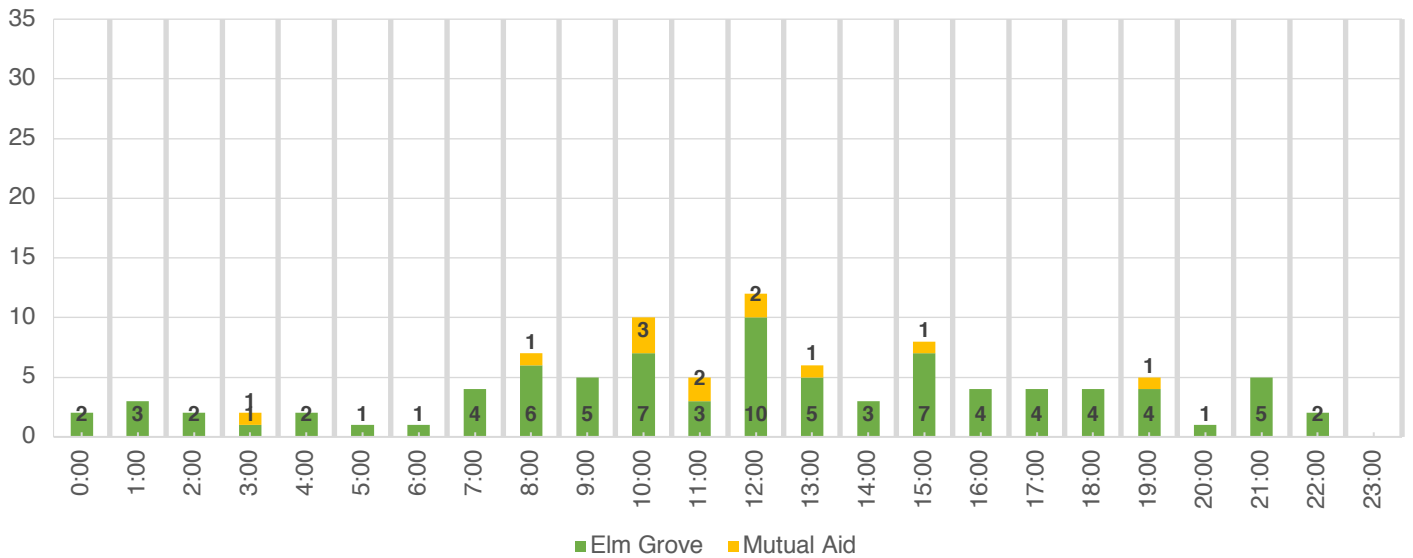

Endnotes

- A Certain calls for service (CFS) may have more than one patient evaluated and/or transported. Note this percentage should not be used when summing the subsections to 100%.
- B CFS where EMS may have provided general rehabilitation to first responders and/or victims on an emergency scene without the creation of a formal patient care report (PCR). If a patient is evaluated in more detail, a PCR is created and is reflected in the "Transported" or "No Transport" categories. "CoQ" is an abbreviation for Change of Quarters.
- C Indicates EMS was cancelled prior to arrival on scene or did not make patient contact.
- D Indicates that both ambulances were in use at the same time (either on the same CFS or two different CFS). Does not include simultaneous calls where mutual aid was requested/given to Elm Grove. Note this percentage should not be used when summing the subsections to 100%.
- E Times are reported to dispatch via radio, marked by dispatch in the computer aided dispatch (CAD) and are entered into the patient care report by the EMT crew. They are therefore at risk for human error. Times do not reflect police response times, nor the EMT/paramedics who respond directly to the scene.
- F Chute Time is time from dispatch to time ambulance is en route. Response Time is time from dispatch to time ambulance is on scene.
- G Total Call Time is time from dispatch to when the call was closed (i.e., whenever the ambulance becomes available for another CFS).
- H Sum of total call hours do not include time spent performing the following activities: Blood draws for the PD, monthly department meetings, committee meetings, trainings, public relation events, return time to the station from hospital/scene, restocking supplies, nor paperwork.
- J "Total # of EMS Personnel" is the total number of EMS personnel responding to the total number of CFS that quarter; does not include police EMTs. Personnel are entered into an electronic database at the end of each call by the EMT crew and are therefore at risk for human error.
- K Not included in calculations.
