BARRICADED SUBJECT – 610 Dunleith Circle, ELM GROVE

On Thursday August 8, 2013, at approximately 2:10PM, Elm Grove officers responded to assist City of Brookfield officers, who were checking in the 600 block of Dunleith Circle, in Elm Grove, for a suspect in a domestic related criminal damage to property offense that had occurred, in Brookfield, earlier in the day.

Officers attempted to make contact with the subject, Scott W. Dummert, 33 years old, who resides on Dunleith Circle and were unsuccessful in making direct contact with him. Dummert refused to come to the door and refused to exit the residence to speak with officers. Dummert began to walk in front of the window of the residence brandishing a large knife. He also started a small fire in the residence that activated fire alarms within the four-plex unit. All other residents were safely evacuated from the four-plex unit. After repeated attempts to reason and negotiate with the subject, tactical officers made entry to the second floor unit, at which point Dummert exited a second floor window and was taken into custody by perimeter officers, at approximately 6:20PM. Dummert sustained minor, non-life threatening injuries and was transported to the Elmbrook Memorial Hospital for treatment and medical clearance. No law enforcement or emergency personnel were injured during this event.

The following law enforcement agencies were involved in this event:

- Village of Elm Grove
- City of Brookfield
- Waukesha County Sheriff's Department Tactical and K-9 Units.

Numerous Fire Department and EMS agencies also assisted the Village of Elm Grove Fire Department and Emergency Medical Services.

Dummert faces charges through the City of Brookfield Police Department, related to their domestic incident. Dummert is also being charged through the Elm Grove Police Department, for failure to comply with an officer's attempt to take person into custody, while armed with a dangerous weapon, and will be held at the Waukesha County Jail facility until his initial court appearance.

The Elm Grove Police Department is thankful for the well coordinated and cooperative response of the City of Brookfield Police and the Waukesha County Sheriff's Department in bringing this matter to a safe and successful conclusion. Additionally, police staff is grateful for the cooperation of business owners and homeowners that were displaced during this event.
